POSITION SUMMARY

The Preschool SSP will rotate between preschool classrooms to assist with managing the overall day-to-day operations of the preschool classrooms in St. Johns Public Schools under the supervision of the Preschool Teacher and will assist in implementing developmentally appropriate activities utilizing the approved curriculum/approach with children. The Preschool SSP will assist with maintaining standards of quality in the classrooms required by State licensure and NAEYC accreditation; record anecdotal observations of children on a daily basis, and assist in completion of the assessment of the children's development where directed by the Preschool Teacher. The selected candidate will interact with children and their families.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

These duties and responsibilities are judged to be "essential functions" in terms of the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA). The statements below are intended to describe the general nature and level of work being performed by a person in this position. They are not to be construed as an exhaustive list of all duties that may be performed by such a person.

Aside from general support of learning and development, the candidate will:

- Create a safe environment designed to promote the physical, cognitive, and emotional growth and development of each child;
- Work cooperatively to develop and implement classroom activities and curriculum;
- Manage classroom and lead transitions from one activity to another;
- Guide children through interactions and foster children's use of language and conflict mediation skills;
- Engage/supervise developmentally appropriate activities inside and outside, participate in children's play, and foster creative use of materials;
- Assist lead teacher with required home visits with students.

Additionally, the Preschool SSP will assist with: keeping accurate records of the children's attendance; meal records; unusual incident reports; medications; allergies; and sign-in sheets for the parents; maintaining the arrangement and appearance of the learning environment.

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RECOMMENDED EMPLOYMENT QUALIFICATIONS

EDUCATION:

- Must have a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent.
- Child Development Credential (CDA) or an Associate's Degree in early childhood education or child development or the equivalent; or an existing 120 hour approval *preferred*.

EXPERIENCE:

- Experience and knowledge in both: Early Childhood Education and developmentally appropriate practices *preferred*.
- Experience with the Connect 4 Learning curriculum *preferred*.
- Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI) training preferred. CPI training will be provided.
- Ability to establish warm supportive relationships with the children, recognize illness symptoms, accept and profit from supervision and constructive criticism, develop and maintain working relationships with staff, and thrive in a team-oriented environment.
- Basic computer skills; experience using Google Apps preferred
- Experience with children in a group setting.
- Experience with activity methods used with young children; materials/equipment used in group settings of young children; positive discipline and redirection techniques.
- Good organizational skills.
