While certainly not required, some parents like to provide supplies for their child. Below is a list of some suggested items for this year. Each student will have their own personal supplies, there will be no community shelf. We will also have these items available for students who need them.

Suggested Supplies for Fourth Grade

- 1 tape bound composition style notebook with lined notebook paper inside cover color/design does not matter; please choose a cardboard, not plastic cover if possible
- a sturdy "homework folder" for papers to and from school- cover design/color does not matter
- 4 folders, please, please, please be sure each has metal "gussets" or brackets inside for holding loose notebook paper: 1 blue, 1 green, 1 yellow, 1 red
- highlighters, 2 ball point correcting pens not blue or black, personal set of earbuds/headphones, labeled in a protective case, colored pencils, pencils and erasers –please send in periodically throughout the year, mechanical pencils with larger size lead are nice, 2 pads of sticky notes- around 3 x 3 inches, a small pencil box or pouch to hold supplies in desk, a box or two of tissues, scissors, glue (stick or liquid), one or two thin dry erase markers, with a cap eraser if possible

Optional supplies: markers, a sturdy ruler, a small calculator, pencil sharpener (with lid for catching shavings). These items are also available on our art and math shelves.

Other items that are appreciated: disinfectant wipes, paper towels, boxes of tissue, snack and sandwich size snap and seal-type bags, small and large size paper plates, 8 oz cups (no styrofoam, please), plastic spoons, stickers for student papers.
